Julie Henderson welcomed the council and turned the meeting over to Chey Lyman. She talked about FAFSA night on October 22 from 6-8 pm. All seniors should come with paperwork filled out. There will be scholarships available for attending. Mrs. Lyman also said the Utah College Application Week will be Oct. 28-30, when colleges will be at SSHS to offer free registration for seniors. Chey talked about scholarship money, and how 4.0 money is monitored, and the rest is not. But applying sooner rather than later is the best to ensure students will get money. Most colleges this year, are only using GPA for scholarships, but not sure if that is something that will be always, or just this year due to Covid.

The minutes were reviewed, Barb Larsen made a motion to approve, Kip Hansen seconded, and all others were in favor.

Mr. Beagley then talked about the new TSSA funds for this year, and how they need to be in line with the school plan goals. There is \$12,266 to spend so Mr. Beagley is thinking about sending an email to the teachers, to see what they need. Robin Hessey said that the funds need to benefit the most students possible...example, the color printer ink in the library could be bought with these funds, because it benefits all students. Barb Larsen and Lisa Nielson suggested microphones, and Kip Hansen suggested Swivels, and Ipads. All were great ideas.

Marsha Johnson was wondering how our online schooling was set up in case of quarantine. Stuart Hepworth said that there were some students that opted for online school, and when they do that, they can log into the class hour and follow along with the class, or the lecture will be posted on Canvas and the students can get on that and do the class work. It is a much better set up this year than in the spring.

Barbara Larsen talked about the Booster club tailgate dinner, and that it was a success, even though there were less people attending than they had planned on. Big Daddy's deli catered it, and really went above to help the Booster club. Barb highly recommends using them for future

events. She also said that they are looking to re-organize the Booster club next year. Maybe having a past president, current president, and a president elect working together. Barb also is reaching out to the other schools in our district to see how their Booster club benefits schools and programs.

Mr. Hepworth mentioned that the Strategic ACT test will be held on November 4, and will be given to all 9th, 10th, and 11th grades students. It will be given on one day, like the ACT making as close to the ACT as possible. Mr. Beagley said that it gives really good data and feed back, and lets the students know what they need to work on for the ACT. Also parent teacher conferences will be held on October 7th-14th, and will be available on zoom with the teachers. Angela Nielsen used zoom with her students' teacher and really liked how it went.

Julie Henderson then asked if there was any other business, there wasn't, so Barbara Larsen made a motion to end this lovely meeting, Marsha Johnson seconded it, and all others approved.
