Angela Nielsen welcomed everyone and reminded the council that they are the eyes and ears of the community, and if they hear anything to bring it to the meetings, or privately with Mr. Madsen. She then turned the meeting over to Angie Chappell to review the minutes from the Sept. 16 meeting. Kip Hansen made a motion to accept the minutes as written, Barb Larsen seconded it, and all others approved.

Chey Lyman talked about the things going on in her office. She has met with all seniors and parents, to make sure they are on track to graduate, future plans, and any questions they might have. Also there will be a free application day, for seniors to apply to colleges. It will be held on Oct. 28- Nov. 1, and the colleges that will be here are SUU, Snow, Dixie, Utah State, and UVU. There will be prizes for applying this year. Also teachers did a Professional Development for the ACT pretest. They learned how to implement the information into classroom teaching, to help students raise scores on the ACT test.

Mr. Beagley then went over the School Improvement plan, and some updates that were made. We want every goal in the School Improvement plan to be tied to the mission statement for the school. Angela Nielsen said to make sure that everything in the School Improvement plan matters, and not just something that checks the boxes. Barb Larsen made a motion to accept the School Improvement plan, Robin Hessey seconded it, and all others approved.

Mr. Beagley told the council that they gym has a new scoreboard/video board. It will be used for advertising and replays during games. Mr. Madsen mentioned that there might be a new video production pathway coming to SSHS, and this new video board will help with that. If it comes to our school, there will opportunities for scholarships and future careers using video production.

Barb Larsen talked about the Booster club and the activities so far this year. The tailgate dinner at the Homecoming game was a small success. They did make money, but not as much as they would have liked to bring in. They start serving dinner at 5:30 and most people aren't at the game at that time. Mr. Madsen said that the Booster club should have a later start time...maybe 6:30 p.m. until halftime. Also they should do the concessions during the homecoming game, so the kids can participate in the activities at the game. Everyone liked that

idea, and Mr. Hansen volunteered the FFA to do a service project of cleaning up after. Barb also mentioned that the Booster club purchased a cotton candy maker, and everything for the Halloween carnival is coming along great. It will be held on October 25.

Lisa Nielson had a concern about freshman students adjusting to high school. Mr. Beagley told the council that every freshman takes a Ram Academy class which is a character education class, focusing specifically on habits that will help a person be effective in school and life. The class teaches specific skills required to be successful in life such as study skills, responsibility, planning, relationships with others, listening and attitude. He also said there is a mentoring program that the student body officers go into each freshman class, to let them know that they can count on the SBO to help them with anything they need at school.

Eligibility check will be on October 17 for the next quarter. The next community council meeting will be held on November 11, 2019 in the SSHS Media Center.

Barb Larsen made a motion to adjourn, Robin Hessey seconded it and all other approved.
