Becky Bastian called the meeting to order, and welcomed everyone, then turned the meeting over to Mr. Madsen. Angie Chappell reviewed the minutes, Kami Sorensen made a motion to approve the minutes, and Melanie Jones seconded it. All other council members were in favor.

Dustin Shakespear talked about college and career readiness planning. He meets with the seniors and a part time councilor meets with the freshmen and their parents. In 10th and 11th grades it is electronically incorporated into some classes. Dustin also informed us that the Regents Scholarship has had a major overhaul. It will now only require a 3.3 gpa, and a 22 on the ACT. It now covers benchmarks for all colleges. The changes will affect more students for good, and will go into effect next year. He also mentioned that Snow College and Utah State have teamed up to offer a few 4 year degrees, including computer science, business, and possibly an elementary ed teacher.

Barbara Larsen talked about the Halloween carnival and how this year was probably the best one that the Booster club has had so far. All the clubs that want to ask the Booster club for money this year, had to participate in the carnival, and there was a really good turnout of students to help. Also the carnival was well supported by the community. Jennifer Keele mentioned that the quilt that the sewing class is making to raffle at home basketball games, will be ready after Thanksgiving. Barbara Larsen also met with Larry Morwood from the district and they have come up with the specifications for the new pavilion that will be built out by the football field. Construction will begin in the spring, and will have a metal roof to cover the existing concrete pad, and lights and power. The school, Booster club, and the district will all help with the funding of this project. Becky Bastian mentioned to Brett Beagley that maybe the shop kids could make a few more picnic tables for this new area.

Principal Madsen informed the council of the Trustlands spending so far. The school has purchased 5 Odysseyware licenses for \$2000, and 2 overhead projectors for \$1118. There is restitution and Odysseyware hours for the teacher over that. SSHS also pays for 2 teachers salaries. Jennifer Baletka has now started working for the school district, so that is not included anymore. Teacher prep hours for \$2400. He also said that the school play was a real success this year. December 20th and 21st will be finals for 1st semester, and school will be out for Christmas break from December 21-January 4. Barbara Larsen made a motion to adjourn and all council members approved.
