Lisa Nielson welcomed the council and turned the meeting over to Angie Chappell to read through the October minutes. Chey Lyman made a motion to approve the minutes, Barb Larsen seconded, and all other council members approved. Chey Lyman then talked about what has been going on in the counseling office. She has been going into the classrooms doing the 4 year plans, and they are coming along great. Chey also asked the council to take a stakeholders survey. She needs to have that done every 3 years, and it is for part of her program curriculum.

The council then read through and talked about the TSSA funding. Teachers submitted a request for items that they need or want.

*Amy Robinson asked for a microphone to help save her voice. It was \$55.

*Devin Woolsey requested a Redcat microphone system for his classroom for \$1500, as well as a set of White boards and markers for the Spanish Department, which was \$250.

*Shelly Adams would also like a Redcat for \$1500 and an Apple pencil for \$130.

*Deb Morgan STEM club requested Rocketry Supplies \$500, and an air monitoring device \$300. She also asked for \$500 for hotel lodging and \$100 vehicle transportation.

*Robin Hessey in the media center asked for \$1200 for black and color ink, for the school printer.

*Kip Hansen wants an Ipad for his Swivel system in his classroom, \$400

*Shauna Blake requested \$1500 for classroom microphone

*James Cavan would like \$899 for an Ipad for his music, \$599 for a bass amp, \$219 for a MIDI keyboard, \$272 sturdy leather folders for music, and \$560 for new Jazz band music, for a total of \$2549.

The council had a lively discussion about the funds, and how they should be spent. Everyone liked the idea of the microphones in the classrooms, and any technology that can be used should be used. They didn't like the idea of the money being used for lodging for Mrs. Morgan's class and didn't want to open that up. Barb Larsen liked the idea that we are adding mics, and technology to the school every year. Shalane Stubbs really wanted to give the band what they

asked for this year, and that was seconded by Lisa Nielson who then said maybe next year, another group could get a large amount, and we could spread that money around each year. Kip Hansen thought that was a good idea, and the money for the band will benefit a lot of kids for many years to come. Everyone thought it was a good idea to give each teacher their requested amount this year. Mr. Beagley wanted to keep some money until after the first of the year, in case anything else came up. So the total we had to spend was \$12,266, and the amount that we gave was \$9984. Kip Hansen made a motion of approve, Liz Memmott seconded it, and all other members agreed.

Mr. Beagley talked about Covid-19 and the impact on SSHS. He stated that there aren't any cases that have started at school, and transferred to someone at school. It's happening outside of school. Kids are doing a great job wearing masks and social distancing. He isn't sure how winter sports will shake out. He then asked how parent/teacher conferences went, and Angela Nielsen said that she really liked the zoom conferences this year, and Mr. Hepworth agreed.

Mr. Hepworth then mentioned the Strategic ACT test, and how it was. It prepares the Jr. to take the ACT, and it prepares the 9th and 10th graders for the aspire test that happens at the end of the year. He also mentioned that SSHS will be going through the accreditation process this spring to renew our accreditation certificate.

Mr. Beagley then said that the next meeting will be held in February 2021.

Barbara Larsen made a motion to end the meeting, Chey Lyman seconded the motion, and all other members approved.
