Mr. Madsen welcomed everyone to the meeting and mentioned that the next two meetings are really important for all members to attend. They will be held on March 16, and April 13. We will be discussing Trustlands budget. He then turned the meeting over to Angie Chappell to review the minutes from the November 11, 2019 meeting. Marsha Johnson made a motion to accept the minutes as written, and Barb Larsen seconded it. All others approved.

Principal Madsen informed the council that the community council information on the school website will be updated and changed a little. Robin Hessey has been working on that, and he showed everyone how it is looking. It will be easier to find all agendas, minutes, budgets, and anything related to the community council.

Mrs. Lyman said that the junior class will be taking the ACT on March 24. It will be online this year. She said that it should be a good way to take the test. Also the ACT is trying something called Superscore. It will be implemented in September 2020, and it will allow students to retake sections of the ACT if needed, instead of the whole ACT test. The aspire test for 9th and 10th graders will be held on May 11-12. It will be a late start time, so school will start around 10:30 a.m. Administration is deciding if they will have an intervention time for students that morning if students want or need to come in.

Trustlands budget will be decided during the next two meetings. It is very important that all council members attend. The meeting was then turned over to Barb Larsen to allocate the Booster Club money. This year there were 10 clubs and teams that wrote letters, and asked for help with their funding. They are as follows:

*Boys Golf \$1000 for new bags (Devin Woolsey was here to explain both Golf proposals)

*Girls Golf \$1000 for new bags

*STEM club \$500 for Southern Utah Science and Engineering Fair

- *Shop Class \$350 for UV Sanitation Cabinet (Kip Hansen explained the reasoning for this)
- *Baseball \$600-800 for help with nets for batting cages, game balls, and bullpen construction
- *9th English class \$200 for prize money for 'Book Trailer Project' (Devin Wooley was here to explain his proposal)
- *Wrestlers \$1500 for new warm up gear
- *Drillteam \$500 for new picture
- *Volleyball \$500 for new uniforms and balls
- *Girls Basketball \$500 for new uniforms
- *Girls Tennis \$600 for a few items to help make their club successful. (Amy Robinson was here to explain her proposal)

For a total of \$7,450.

As the council talked and discussed it was decided that most everyone would get the amount that they asked for except Baseball, and they would receive \$600, Wrestling would get \$500, and the Golf teams would each get \$500, for a total of \$5,250. Barb Larsen made a motion to accept, Dustyn Allen seconded it, and all other approved.

Mr. Madsen then mentioned that eligibility check for spring sports will be on March 6. He also said that girls basketball is ranked #1 in the RPI and are region champs, the boys are ranked #10 in RPI. Drillteam won state for the 7th time, cheer took region, Logan Hansen placed in 2 swim events at state, state wrestling is this weekend, and there are several boys on the team that are favored to do well at state. Parent teacher conferences are coming up, and we are working on next year's schedule. Registration will be April 1 for next year's seniors, April 15 for next year's juniors, April 22 for next year's sophomores, and April 29 for next year's freshman.

At the beginning of 2nd semester SSHS sent out a new attendance policy. It was met with some concern from the community, and parents in the council wanted to understand more about it. Mr. Madsen and Mr. Beagley explained that it was absences for A days and B days. At two absences the counselor will talk to the student and ask if they need any help. At four absences the counselor will meet with the student and parents. It is more of an intervention than anything else. Mr. Madsen looked at all the students with F grades, and 78% were due to absences. Lisa Nielson mentioned that the wording is what had the community riled up. SSHS has the least amount of F's in all the high schools in the district, and we want students to succeed. SSHS's main goal is to help kids and keep them educated. If they stay in school, they will have a better chance at passing class.

Marsha Johnson made a motion to adjourn, Barb Larsen seconded it, and all other members approved.
