Carma Gifford welcomed everyone and then turned the meeting over to Mr. Madsen. We watched a short film on the positives effects that the special needs kids have on students and faculty, and how it helps our hearts be happy. Mike Miles presented his request for booster club funding, for the girl's softball program. He explained what the money would be used for, and what they might be doing for fundraising. He was then excused so we could finish our meeting. Angie Chappell reviewed the minutes, and Barbara Larsen made a motion to approve, Marsha Johnson seconded it, and all others approved. Chey Lyman talked about how our school is making a big push for all of our students to get the SafeUT app on their phones. She said it has been used and it is a good thing. On Feb. 20 the juniors will be taking the ACT test, and there is no school for 9th, 10th, and 12th grade students. Parent Teacher conference will also be held on Feb. 20, 5:30-7:00 p.m. This year, teachers will be in their classrooms and will set up appts with students who are struggling and any other concerned students. On Feb. 27, there is a college day at Richfield High School for all juniors. Chey Lyman said that it is a great opportunity because students talk with college counselors, and when they talk they are more likely to attend college.

Barbara Larsen discussed Booster club money and the council reviewed the requests for funding this year. Girls basketball asked for \$1200, Baseball asked for \$800, Volleyball requested \$500, Girls golf asked for \$800, Girls softball requested \$950, Pep band requested \$1735, and Yearbook requested \$300, for a total of \$6,285. It was suggested that all clubs and teams get \$500, with an exception for the band, and give them \$1000. Also some money will go towards a new scoreboard for the main gym. Barbara Larsen made a motion to accept this proposal, Dustyn Allen seconded it, and all were in favor.

Mr. Madsen talked about the Trustlands budget. There were several things that we have used it for this year already. Software \$1,750, Technology supplies \$7,187, Certified hours \$10,499,

Paraprofessional hours \$6,432, Fringe benefits \$2,680. We have spent \$28,498 and have \$30,670 to use. Next year's budget will be \$60,000. The new freshman class is a little smaller so our budget was cut a ½ teacher, so Mr. Madsen would like to use some of that to fund the teacher for next year. Mr. Madsen said that all the teachers in the high school have been reading the book "Culturize" It talks about good culture at our schools. Mr. Madsen said that we have positive students and he attributes a lot of that to our student body officers this year. Lisa Nielson made a comment about all the great things that our school has been doing, and wants the community to know all about it.

Mr. Madsen mentioned that Kathleen Shoemig, a community member wants to add seating instead of bleachers on the parent side of the gym. She is willing to do a fundraiser. There are bids that have been put out there to see how much a couple of different ideas would be. We will know more in a few months.

Mid semester check for eligibility will be March 15.

The next community council meeting will be held on March 11th in the Media Center.
