Melanie Jones welcomed everyone to the meeting, and reviewed the minutes from the February 2017 meeting. Becky Bastian made a motion to accept the minutes, and Barbara Larsen seconded it. All other council members were in favor of the minutes. Melanie Jones then turned the meeting over to Dustin Shakespear for an update.

Mr. Shakespear told the council that all juniors took the ACT test, so there are no make ups this year. Also the ACT prep class will start again on March 14 during ram time. This is a great benefit to help the students get ready to take the ACT or to improve their score. As a reminder, Mr. Shakespear said that next year's schedule will be a set AB schedule. On March 23, there will be a mixed assembly with Alan Pearson coming to talk about appropriate usage of cell phones, and a new app called Safe UT app. It will be an app that students can text or call if they or someone they know, is struggling or having problems with suicidal thoughts or actions.

Mr. Madsen gave an update about all the teacher changes happening next year. Mrs. Topham in the media center is retiring, Mr. Jenkins won't be coming back next year, and Tami Smith will be transferring to RHS. Also Mrs. Nilsson is retiring, Mr. Evans is moving to Idaho, and Mr. Hepworth will be teaching the English 1010 class through Snow College.

Principal Madsen then reviewed the Trustlands budget. Odyssey--Credit Recovery will be \$3200 for the teacher, and the licences are \$2750. The teacher that does restitution is \$1400. The library pays for half of the AC Reader licences, but Trustlands helps with the other half at \$1250. \$1000 goes to repairs and maintenance. \$12000 will be for Ednet coordinator, \$3000 for books for classrooms. \$19000 for part-time teacher to cover PE and a health class. Because of the small attendance today, these were out for review only, except for the part-time teacher. That needed to be approved or not, so that it could be opened up with the district to fill this position. It was voted on to approve the part-time teacher, and Barbara Larsen made a motion to accept, and Becky Bastian seconded it. All other council members were in favor. We will hold a special meeting on March 29 @ 3:30 to finalize the Trustlands budget, so it can be turned in on time.

Mr. Madsen then told the council that several teachers received awards recently. JoAnn Topham received the Para-professional of the Year, award. James Cavan was nominated for a UEA award, and Deb Morgan won a NASA award. She will be able to bring NASA teachings into her science classes. There are very few teachers around the US that are awarded this, and she is the only teacher in the State of Utah to receive it. Congratulations teachers.

Barbara Larsen said that she received a thank you card from the FFA for the money that was given to them from the Booster Club. JoAnn Topham made a motion to adjourn and Barbara Larsen seconded it. All other council members in favor. The next community council meeting will be March 29, and then the following will be April 10 at 3:30 in the media center.
