Joelle Eyre called the meeting to order, and welcomed everyone, then turned the meeting over to Mr. Madsen. The committee members reviewed the minutes. Marsha Johnson made a motion to approve the minutes, and Barbara Larsen seconded it. All other council members were in favor.

Mr. Shakespear said that the awards assembly will be held on May 18 at 10 a.m. After the awards the seniors will get their cap and gown pictures and then go to the Elementary school and do a parade through the halls. Many parents in the meeting said that their Elementary age students loved seeing all the graduates. It will be dress up day, and it turns out to be a special day for all. Mr. Shakespear also said that Zach Bagley won the Daniels Scholarship which is great. It also makes 3 in a row from our school, so that is quite the accomplishment. Local scholarships are being filled out by seniors.

Mr. Madsen talked about the changes that are coming to our school for next year. First off, Dustin Shakespear will be leaving to take a position at the CTE center in Richfield. Barbara Balch will be retiring at the end of the year, and Janene Torgerson will take her place as a full time Special Ed teacher, and Becky Bastian will work as a ½ Special Ed teacher. We have a few more positions that have been offered and are waiting for finalization. Mr. Madsen also informed us the registration for next year will be held on April 18 for upcoming seniors, the following week, April 25 for upcoming juniors, and then on May 2 for upcoming sophomores. This will take place in the evening from 6-8 p.m. Snow College and CTE representation will be here to show what they offer for those students that are interested in attending there.

The council voted on the Trustlands budget. There was \$61,000 to spend, and it needed to be spent on improving education outcomes. It was decided that \$2000 would be used for Odysseyware licenses, and \$4000 would be used for restitution and Odysseyware hours, for a total of \$6000. Marsha Johnson made a motion to accept, and Barbara Larsen seconded it. All other council members were in favor. It was also decided that \$20,000 would be used for a ½

time teacher, and that \$18,000 would be used for the Ednet teacher, for a total of \$38,000. Robyn Hessey made a motion to accept, and Joelle Eyre seconded it. All other council members were in favor. Lastly, the council decided to spend \$6000 for an ACT bootcamp that will prepare the juniors for the ACT, and a new program called Aspire that will be a pre ACT test for 9th and 10th grades students, and it provides really good information and feedback on the testing. The cost for that is \$7500, for a total of \$13,500. The total Trustlands budget that was decided on was \$57,500. Barbara Larsen made a motion to accept, and Marsha Johnson seconded it. All other council members were in favor.

Mrs. Sorensen talked about the Haiti breakfast that the National Honor Society is hosting as a fundraiser to send kids in Haiti to school. Last year the fundraiser made enough money to send 6 kids in Haiti to school for a year and it includes one meal per day. This year the fundraiser will be held on April 27, and the community will be invited.
