Mr. Beagley welcomed the community council members, and asked all to introduce themselves and tell how they are connected to the school. Mrs. Lyman then told us that she is doing senior CCR (College, and Career Readiness) interviews with every senior and a parent when possible. They are going good. Mr. McCormick is doing 9th grade CCR's, 10th grade will have a class room CCR with Mrs. Lyman and 11th grade will have individual CCR's with Mrs. Lyman starting in November. She also informed us that Ms. Farrer is starting a program that rewards good behavior. It is 'Real Rams Show Heart', and 'heart' stands for H-helpful, E-engaged, A-ambitious, R-resilient, T-trustworthy. There are posters around the school, in the gyms, and on the fields.

Mr. Beagley then had the council watch a training video about the Roles and Responsibilities of the Community Council. After that Mr. Hansen explained Robert's rules of order, for us to follow in our meetings. Basically it will let us have an orderly and respectful meeting. It states that anybody can speak or be involved, and rules to conduct a meeting, including having an agenda, discussions, make motions and seconds, and vote. It was informative. We then went on to vote in a new chair, and co-chair persons. Lisa Nielson nominated Liz Memmott, but Liz withdrew that nomination, Julie Henderson stated that she would be happy to do it, and Lisa Nielson said that she would be happy to be the co- chair. All council members were in favor.

The Booster Club is having a tailgate dinner on Friday for the football game against Richfield, and it is all ready to go. There will not be a Halloween carnival this year, due to Covid.

Mr. Beagley reviewed last year's Trustlands budget so the community council will know what their responsibilities are for that and explained how the money was spent. He said that Homecoming week went really well and is pleased how everything went. Mr. Hepworth talked about the Strategic ACT (which is a practice ACT test) on November 4th, and how important that information will be since we don't have that information from last year. The conversation then turned to community concerns, and Julie Henderson mentioned that she had heard some things about a student from our school testing positive for Covid, and what was being done

about that. Mr. Beagley explained what the protocol is when that happens and put everyone's concern to rest. Lisa Nielson said that the teachers are doing a really good job cleaning and planning for being safe. She said that if parents are positive and ok, then the kids will be positive and ok with it. We just need to stay positive and diligent. Mr. Beagley said the kids are doing better than he expected them to do with wearing masks, and social distancing.

Chey Lyman moved to close the meeting, Shalane Stubbs seconded the motion, and all others were in favor.
