Carma Gifford welcomed everyone and then turned the meeting over to Angie Chappell to review the minutes. Kip Hansen made a motion to accept the minutes, Barb Larsen seconded it, and all were in favor. Chey Lyman talked about all the local scholarships that are for our school, and that the majority of them are due, the Monday after we return from spring break. Registration for classes for next year will start this week. Wednesday night, April 10 at 6 p.m. next year's seniors will come to register. They will meet in the auditorium as a group and then meet with their advisor's to build a schedule. This will continue on April 24th for next year's juniors, May 1st for next year's sophomores, and May 8th for next year's freshman. Mrs. Lyman has an assembly scheduled for the new freshmen, and is inviting parents so they can go over the scheduling process and our school procedures. Chey also said that SSHS leads in Sevier School District for Pathways completed. Some council members weren't sure what a pathway was, so she explained that it was 3 credits in a CTE cluster. We offer pathways in several areas, including but not limited to, Art, Business, Agriculture, Home ec, and Science. Mrs. Lyman also mentioned that our school is doing a 'walk of champions' for pathway completers, because we want to congratulate the students, and let them know that our school thinks that education is as important as sports.

Wendy Roberts and Devin Woolsey from the drama department, talked about how old the current soundbar is in the auditorium, and how the microphones don't work with it. They wanted to see if the Booster Club/Community Council would help them with \$4,000-\$15,000 to go towards a new soundbar. Kip Hansen suggested that they apply for a grant, and all thought that was a good idea. Also drama kids will help by doing a fundraiser. It was tabled until next community council meeting.

Mr. Beagley read through the School Land Trust Budget and amendment. Spending so far is Software \$1750, Technology supplies \$12,863, Certified hours \$11,442, Paraprofessional hours \$8920, Fringe benefits \$3138. An amendment to 208-2019 budget was to give teachers 4 hours at the end of the school year to finish up grading and end of year items, for a total of \$3000. Carma Gifford made a motion to approve, Barbara Larsen seconded it, and all others were in favor. Trustland budget for 2019-2020 is as follows. \$3000 for teacher to teach the credit recovery after school and on Wednesday nights. \$1000 for teacher to facilitate the restitution sessions. \$1750 for Odysseyware licenses for credit recovery. \$15,000 for Ednet teacher 5 hours per day for 180 days in Ednet classroom. \$40,000 to pay for two teachers for the year. \$3000 for 4 hours of preparation time for teachers to get ready for the new year. Barbara Larsen made a motion to accept 2019-2020 Trustlands budget, Dustyn Allen seconded it, and all others were in favor.

Lisa Nielson has worked on trying to help find a drama teacher for our school. It is hard because it would be part time. There was a lively discussion about it with the council members. Nothing was decided, but members felt good about the conversation.

On April 29th at 6 p.m. there will be an assembly for parents on the harms of social media, at the Richfield High School auditorium. It will be given by Collin Kartchner. Fall 2019 eligibility check for grades will be on May 24th. Aspire test for 9th and 10th graders will be held on May 13th and 14th with a modified Friday schedule for those days. There will be an awards assembly on May 15th, and graduate walk through at the elementary school. 2019 high school graduation will be May 24 at 4 p.m. at the SVC in Richfield.

This is the last community council meeting for the 2018-2019 school year. Thanks to all members who were a part of this group, and with their help in school matters. The next meeting will be Sept. 2019. Carma Gifford made a motion to adjourn, Marsha Johnson seconded it, and all others were in favor.
