To the parents and/or guardians of Juniors/Seniors of the 2013-14 school year:

The purpose of this letter is to discuss the opportunities for your student to take college classes at South Sevier High School. Concurrent enrollment classes are offered through Snow College, and the following classes will be taught this year:

Registration for Snow College courses will now be completed online, and it is the responsibility of the student to ensure that they are registered for concurrent enrollment. Taking the course for high school credit does NOT register students for concurrent enrollment credit. Complete instructions for registering for CE courses may be found at <http://www.snow.edu/ce/images/student.pdf>. Follow these procedures exactly so as to not make mistakes. For MATH, a minimum requirement to enroll is an ACT of 23 or higher, or an Accuplacer score of 90 or higher (students must take the ACT at least once prior to taking an Accuplacer test). For ENGL 1010, a minimum requirement to enroll is English ACT of 17 or higher. After you have registered, your counselor or teacher will send your ACT score to Snow College to complete the registration process for that class. You cannot be registered unless you meet the minimum ACT score requirement, although you may take the course for high school credit only. All other classes do not have entrance requirements, but the instructor has the final say on whether or not a student may be enrolled in their class. College classes in high school are intended for college-bound students who already have a strong academic work ethic, and have demonstrated excellent classroom performance.

Registration opens on April 10, 2013, and students that register BEFORE August 21, 2013 will NOT need to pay the \$30 registration fee. On and after August 21, 2013 you will be charged a \$30 registration fee. Snow College is now \$5 per credit hour for concurrent enrollment classes. You are expected to pay this fee at the time of online registration.

It is highly recommended that college-bound students take as many college classes that they can, while they are in high school. The overall cost is minimal when compared to the actual cost of tuition that colleges charge. Many Seniors fall into the trap of taking easy courses their last year, or doing parent/work release time. Some Seniors feel that they are done with school, and as such tend to steer away from college courses in high school. We recommend that Seniors fill their schedules with college courses while still in high school. Taking college courses while in high school saves a great deal of time and money, and prepares students for a better future in their chosen profession.
